Biblical Languages

At the beginning of every year we are happy to start new Greek and Hebrew classes. Dr Augustine Pagolu will be teaching Hebrew and I will be teaching New Testament Greek. For the latter we have a dual approach. One can either take a 8 week course in Greek, starting in February and meetings on Saturday afternoons. At the end of this course you will be able to read, speak and understand NT Greek. Impossible? Well, come and see. Of course you will not be an expert but you will at least be able to say to someone, "It's all Greek to me" (in the sense that you do not understand a word of what is said in Greek). At the end of this course you can decide to stop or to continue and do our serious course which lasts two years and which enables you to competent in going through the New Testament in the original language. As for Hebrew, I am sure that Dr Pagolu will be glad to talk with anyone interested in knowing what is involved in studying Biblical Hebrew.

As the year draws to a close, there is much we are thankful for. Firstly, God has blessed us with a new member in the family: Isaiah Lai Zhi-Xin ('Persistent Faith'in Mandarin). Isaiah was born on 31 Jul 2005 (8 lbs) after 3 hrs of labor. Since then, he has doubled his weight and brought much joy to our family. Fide definitely prefers life with Isaiah. Studies at Regent

Secondly, I completed my Masters of Christian Studies (MCS) in end Nov. I marvel at God's grace and mercy over the last 18 months at Regent. In times of self-doubt, He has granted encouragement. In times of academic deadlines, He has granted wisdom. In times when my soul is afflicted by personal 'demons', i.e. personal pride, a judgmental attitude, a prayerless life, lust and so on, He rejuvenates my soul and leads me back to His paths of righteousness. God has been faithful in my spiritual rollercoaster, even when I am not (more reflections on this later).

What's next? Well, I have commenced my Masters of Theology (ThM). I hope to complete it by 2007. Let me explain. The MCS is an introductory degree that lays the foundation for theological studies (similar to a MBA). The ThM (similar to a Masters of Science) is based on a major thesis & prepares one to teach. So what's my thesis topic?

I will be studying *John Chrysostom's view of Christian Transformation*. John ministered in the late 4th century AD. These were exciting times: Christianity had just become the favored religion of the Roman Empire; a wide variety of people were becoming Christians – the rich, beggars, soldiers, governors, even the Emperor! This privileged status of Christianity, however, meant that many lukewarm Christians entered the Church. To uphold the Church's integrity, John preached valiantly against lukewarm spirituality. Over time, he infuriated many and was finally exiled to the wilderness of Turkey. For this reason, he is one of the most respected church fathers in history. I hope to better understand his views

of the Christian life, & consider how his spiritual insights may speak to our present generation.
